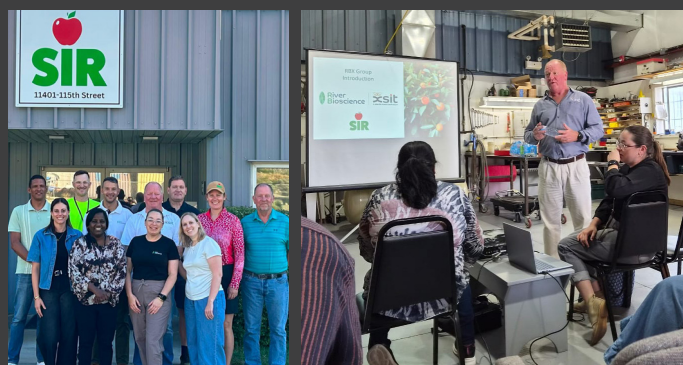
The visit provided a unique opportunity for our teams to connect with the dedicated professionals at OKSIR, who operate within the SIT industry on the other side of the world. Although separated by thousands of kilometres, it quickly became clear that we share many of the same goals, challenges, and a mutual passion for advancing sustainable pest management.

During our time at the OKSIR facility, we explored every stage of their mass rearing process, gaining valuable insight into their production systems, quality control measures, and operational practices. The visit was far more than simply an opportunity to observe; it was a true exchange of knowledge. Through open discussions, both teams shared experiences, compared different approaches, and exchanged practical ideas aimed at improving efficiency and production. It was rewarding to learn from their expertise while also sharing our own experiences and successes.

One of the highlights of the visit was spending time with the teams involved in insect sterilisation. We shared updates on the exciting progress being made in X-ray sterilisation technology research and discussed the ongoing use of cobalt irradiation sources. Working alongside colleagues from another part of the world reinforced the importance of sharing knowledge and learning from one another. We returned home with a wealth of practical ideas to trial and implement within our own facilities, while also leaving our colleagues at OKSIR with insights and approaches that may support their future developments.
